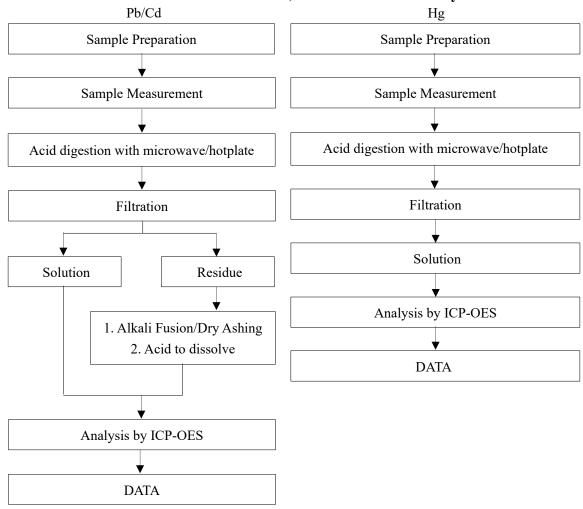

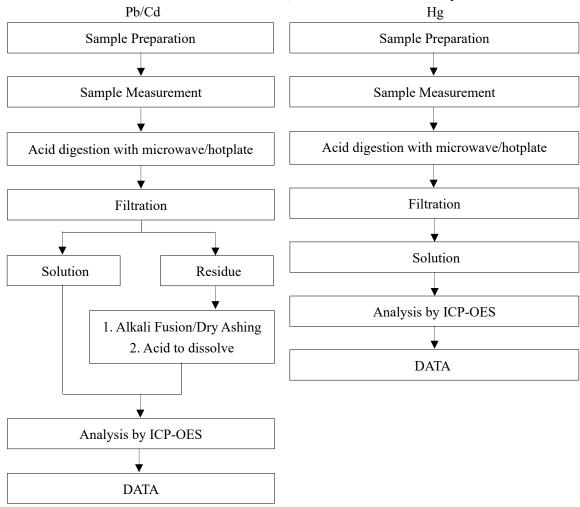

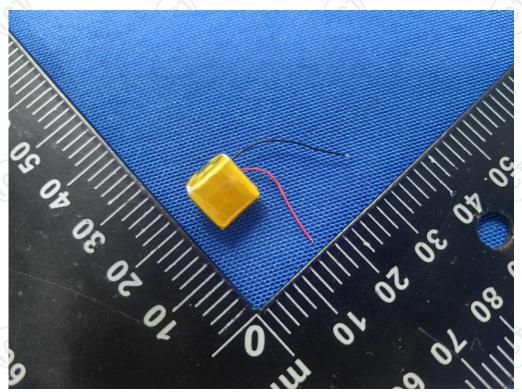

Picture 1. Front view of battery



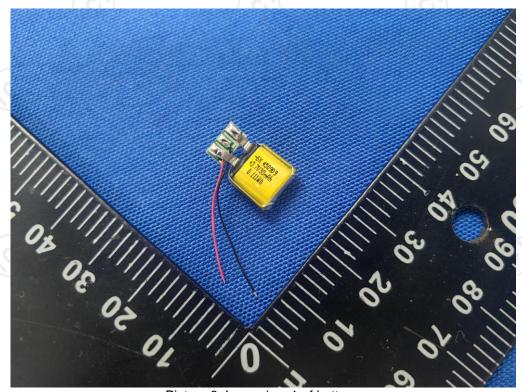
Picture 2. Back view of battery



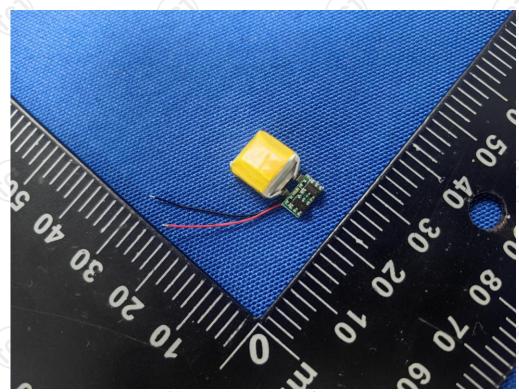

Picture 3 Inner view-1 of battery



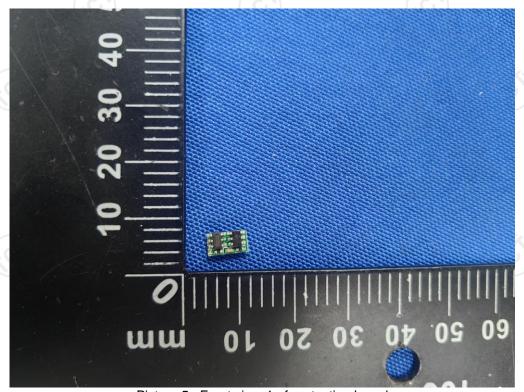

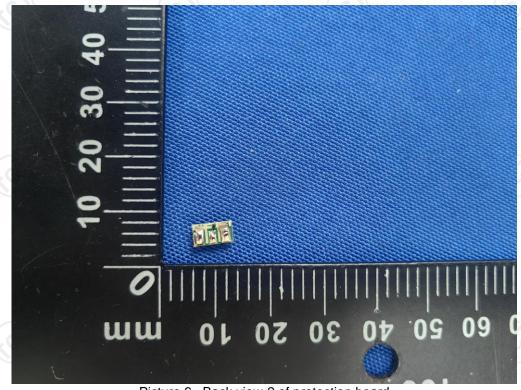

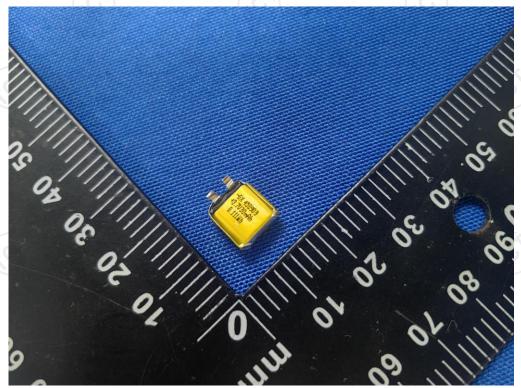

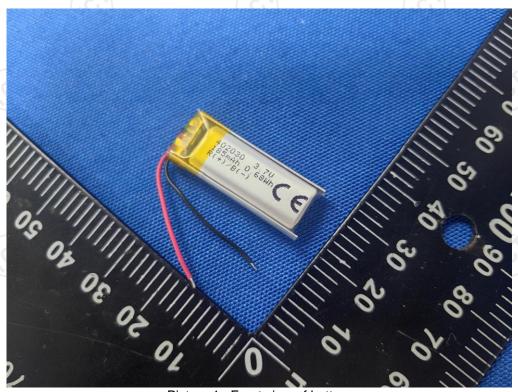

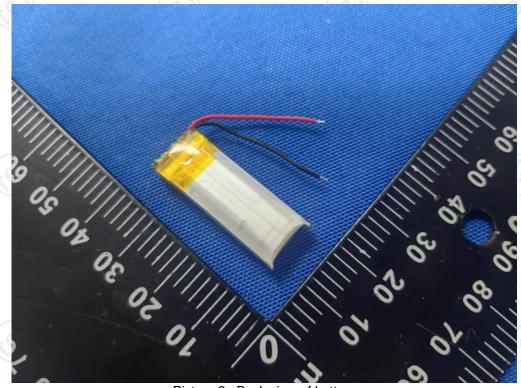

Picture 1. Front view of battery



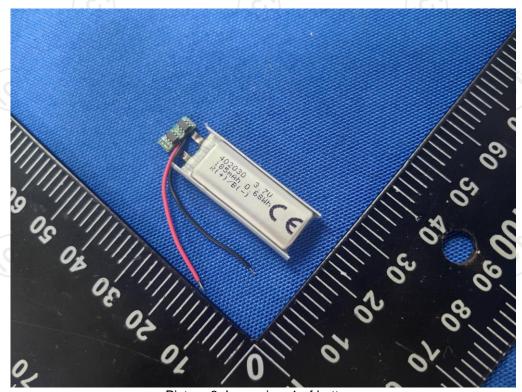
Picture 2. Back view of battery



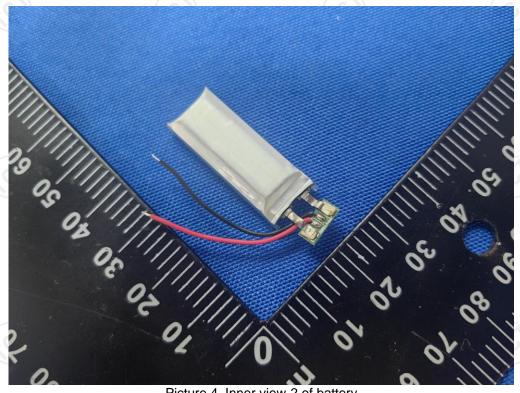

Picture 3 Inner view-1 of battery



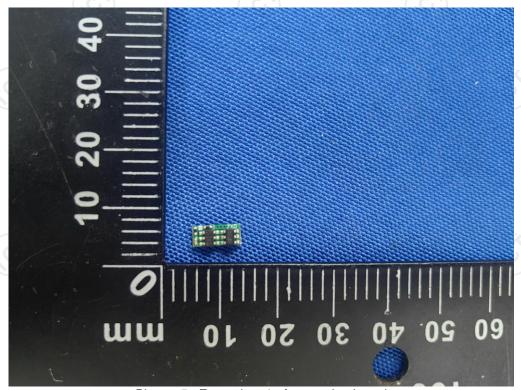

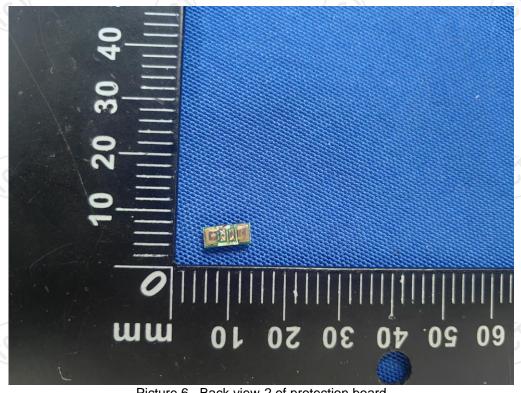

Picture 5. Front view-1 of protection board



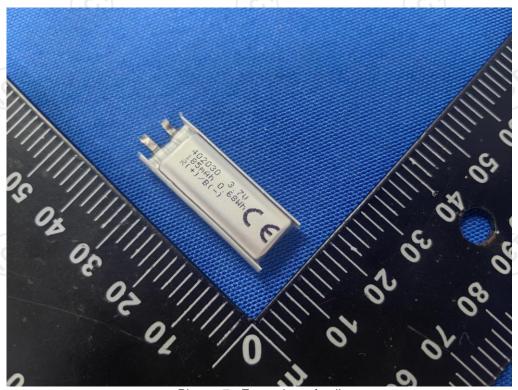

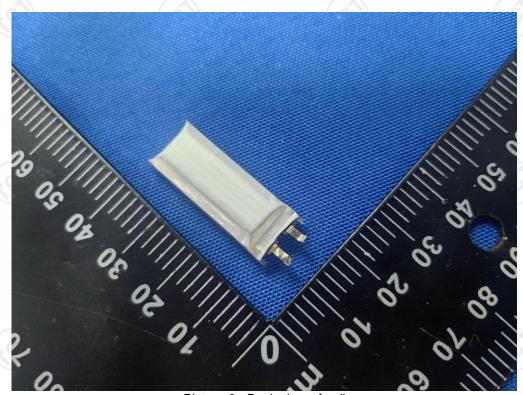
